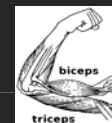


Secondary Teacher Preparation in Kinesiology Fast Track: Sample 4-year plan



Note to students: Remember that this is a SAMPLE. Your schedule, for many reasons, will probably not end up looking exactly like this. What's shown is a "fast-track" schedule. Be aware that you also have the option of completing the Kinesiology major over a four-year period, with a fifth year reserved for your teaching credential. Assumptions underlying this plan:

1. That the Competent and Compassionate Action requirement in Serving Society or Communicating Cross-Culturally will be met through either a course in the major, through ED 101, or through a Common Inquiries course.
2. That the student will fulfill Common Skills: B (Quantitative and Analytical Reasoning) at the same time as one of the Common Inquiry Courses.
3. That the student will fulfill the Competent & Compassionate Action (A): Productions/Research/Integrating, either through one of the courses listed here, or through a non-course-linked assignment.

NOTE: Students may want to consider the Kinesiology May Term (KNS 72: Foundations, KNS elective, and PEA).
