

Sample Plan for Completing the General Education Program.

Be sure to consult with your academic advisor as you map out your plan. The best order and timing of one's general education courses can be greatly affected by the choice of a major or by planning for an off-campus experience. Moreover, some programs expect a student to use specific courses when fulfilling some of the general education requirements.

For the sake of flexibility, the plan below identifies general education categories rather than courses.

First Year

Life and Literature of the New Testament
Introduction to Christian Doctrine
World History in Christian Perspective
Philosophical Reflections on Truth and Value
Writing for the Liberal Arts
Fitness for Life
Second Physical Education course
Two Common Inquiries course related to your probable major

Second Year

Life and Literature of the Old Testament
Modern/Foreign Language
Four additional Common Inquiries courses
(including a writing/speech-intensive course and one that fulfills Quantitative and Analytical Reasoning)
Two additional Physical Education courses

Third and Fourth Years

Two additional Common Inquiries courses
Writing/speech intensive course within the major
Integrating the Major Discipline
Serving Society; Enacting Justice
