

Elementary Teacher Preparation – Liberal Studies Major Fast Track: Sample 4-year plan



Note to students and advisors: Remember that this is a SAMPLE. Your schedule, for many reasons, will probably not end up looking exactly like this. What's shown is a "fast-track" schedule. Be aware that you also have the option of completing the Liberal Studies major over a four-year period, with a fifth year reserved for your teaching credential. Your acceptance into Westmont does not automatically entitle you to admission into the Credential Program. In order to enter the Credential Program, you will need to apply separately during your final year of regular study. Among other conditions, you will need to have earned a 2.75 GPA and a passing score on the CSET. See the college catalog for details on admission to the program.

- Students who choose not to complete the teacher preparation program as a part of their four-year program, or who have not been admitted to the credential program, will replace the education courses listed in the fourth year with elective units.
- Based on the "fast-track" schedule above, you would need to take a minimum of 2 elective units in May Term or summer school, or bring into Westmont 2+ units of AP credit.
- As noted previously, you must apply separately to enter the Credential Program. Among other conditions, you need to have a 2.75 GPA and a passing score on the CSET exams.
- Students who choose the "fast-track" option must complete ALL requirements for graduation by December of their Senior year. Otherwise, they do not qualify for the tuition discount the Spring semester of student teaching. It is not possible to complete the Liberal Studies major in December with "deficient" units.
