RS 010, Introduction to New Testament: I averaged out enrollment totals over one semester and applied it to all years. Average enrollment has been lower than historical averages because we've had 3 New Testament professors on campus.

*RS 110, spring 2017: unusually low enrollment due to overlap with a class on Luke and Acts offered fall 2016 (enrollment: 16)

RATIONALE FOR POSITION

The RS department has a definite need for a tenure-track position in New Testament to support both the RS GE courses, the Greek program, and upper division New Testament courses. Each New Testament professor teaches (at least) three sections of RS 010 per year, serving (at least) 135 students, plus two Greek classes (approximately 25 students) and additional Greek tutorials for advanced students, and an upper division specialization (approximately 15 students). To continue to support the Westmont GE program and also the Religious Studies major and Biblical Languages minor, a tenure track position in New Testament is necessary.

If this position is unfilled, the department will either lose the Greek program and upper division New Testament classes so that one professor can teach six sections of RS 010 per year, or the department would need to hire adjuncts each semester to cover RS 010. Neither option is particularly palatable, or supportable in the long term.

Position Job Description

Tenure-track position in New Testament at the rank of assistant or associate professor. A specialization in New Testament is required, with secondary expertise in Old Testament, Theology, or Church History desirable to support the Religious Studies GE courses and upper division courses as needed. Courses to be taught include RS 010 (3 sections per year); GRK 001, 002, 101, 102 (2 courses per year); and RS 110, 111, 112, 113, 114, and 107 (1 course per year). Applicants should be active in the guild through publications and conference participation, and willing to share in the common work of the department and college.
