

Sara Beth Fentress is the Executive Director of 127 Worldwide, a non-profit based in Raleigh, NC. 127 Worldwide seeks to connect and equip the global body of Christ to care for the vulnerable with excellence.

C.S. Lewis served as a Fellow and Tutor in English Literature at Oxford University and Chair of Medieval and Renaissance Literature at Cambridge University, and is the author of *Mere Christianity*, *Out of the Silent Planet*, *The Great Divorce*, *The Screwtape Letters*, and the universally acknowledged classics in *The Chronicles of Narnia*.

Jacob Byers served in evangelistic work with the Brethren in Christ Church in Illinois, Iowa, San Diego and Los Angeles. In 1893 Byers wrote a book, *The Grace of Healing*, to describe his conversion, along with many hymns.
