**Footnotes:**

**Three Writing-Intensive or Speech-Intensive Courses are required.**

- a) Writing for the Liberal Arts: Many students will fulfill the requirement by taking ENGL 001A.
- b) Students with qualifying test scores (e.g., ACT, SAT WR) may fulfill the Writing for the Liberal Arts requirement by taking a writing-intensive course offered by any department. See Westmont catalog for qualifying scores.
- c) Students are required to take at least one writing-intensive or speech-intensive course in their major and one course outside their major.
