OUTREACH AND SERVICE OPPORTUNITIES

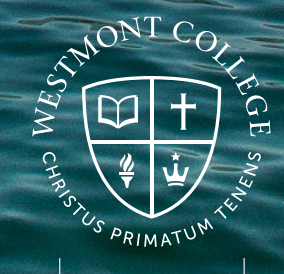

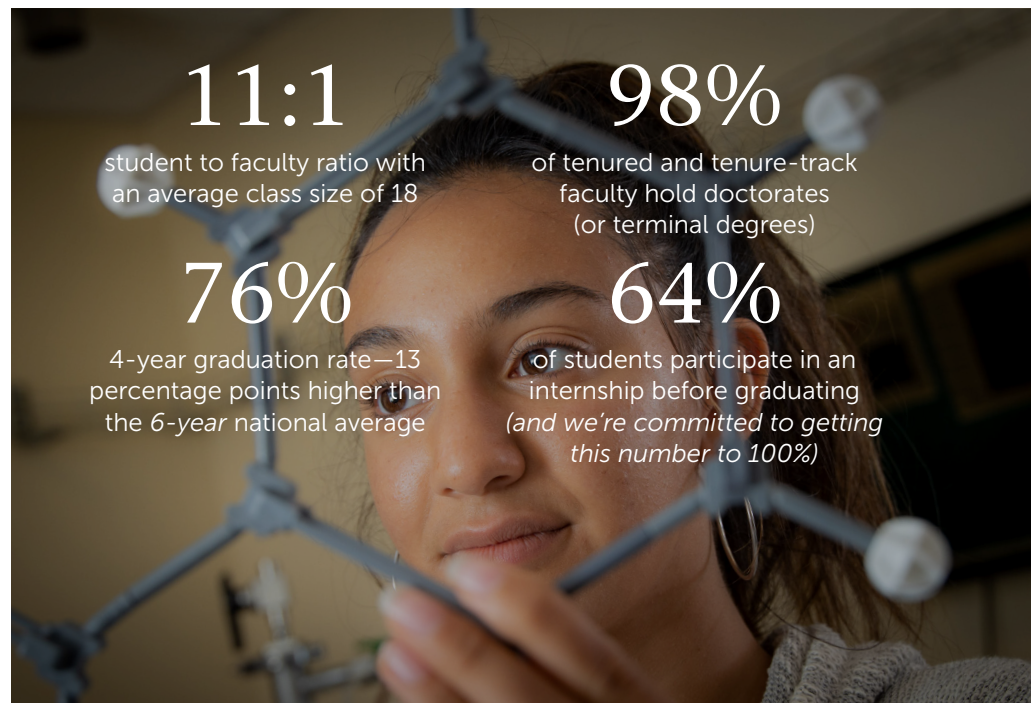
